Note the fee **\$185** and you still need to get a **2024** business license but we will still have fun!



# Maroger's important contribution to the contemporary artist by Joe McDonnell

Paris is truly one of the greatest cities in the world. Filled with incredible museums, galleries, book and art stalls along the quais of the Seine, wide boulevards, delicious foods, tasty wines, picturesque buildings and artists in plazas painting and selling their work. It's where I met La Jaconde, Monet, Dali, Giorgione (he was just a friend with a BMW motorcycle that he let me drive!), Titian and Tintoretto, Rubens and Rembrandt! In 1960, a chance encounter brought together master artists Siegfried Hahn and Howard Wexler and an aspiring artist Joe McDonnell to form a teacher/student relationship that introduced that novice to the medium I use today from the man who rediscovered it.

**Jacques Maroger** (1884–1962) was a painter and the technical director of the Louvre Museum's restoration laboratory in Paris. From 1930 to 1939, he worked as Technical Director of the Louvre Laboratory. He served as a professor at the Louvre School, he was a Member of the Conservation Committee, a General Secretary of the International Experts, and President of the Restorers of France. He devoted his life to understanding the oil-based media of the Old Masters.

The <u>Maroger mediums</u> are made up in Italian and Flemish formulas. They were resurrected from restoration samples that Maroger discovered in the paintings of Flemish and Venetian artists. *They are a two part, mastic and beeswax oil painting material that re-creates the lighting effects, brushwork and the transparency in the shadows that gives a painting depth without losing detail as practiced by the old <i>European masters*. Both mediums are mixed right into the raw paint on the palette and can be used individually or together.


The "Venetian" medium, developed by Italian/Venetian painters, is based on the use of beeswax which artists found, added a suppleness to the oil paints, eliminating cracking over time regardless of thickness of paint application.

**The "Flemish" medium,** employed by Dutch painters, gives the paint a "glowing, fresh, just painted" look eliminating that "dry, flaky" final appearance due to the turpentine's evaporation of the paints natural oils, and eliminating the need for a final glossy (and over time, yellowing with age) varnish.

I'll try to give you an idea of how you members might benefit from your experimentation and use in your oil paintings (unfortunately there are no such materials to use in watercolors or acrylics.).

For those of you who would like to get "hands on," I'm open to a demo at my place. You bring your palette, paint and canvas/board and I'll supply some of both mediums!







WARNING! These mediums are made from the original recipe and contain Lead Oxide. One must be careful when cooking it and painting with it. It does emit a rather noxious odor during the cooking process as well as when painting with it. Gloves are recommended as well as keeping the painting area well ventilated! Wash hands.






